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Strategic model according...

Models are helpful, but

- The AT/Styrian reality is not one-dimensional according to one model
- In a cursory view, AT/Sty belongs to "employment-centred" ("continental") model with strong selection…
- In a deeper view, there are different aspects, for social issues, social commitment, inclusion,
 - Thesis: Austria(and Styria) has a selectiv system
 - But, with an integrative attitude e.g. inclusive VET
- The performance of transition and youth employment – also from the social perspective - allows the question:

what is really relevant?







Strategic "model" Styria

- AT/Styria tries to combine various aspects of the "models" (up2Youth is not the only one, e.g. also refering to Caroleo and Pastore...)
- Some of them are setted by national constitution, laws and regulations
- But, there are open options to act at regional level, e.g. in the "Regional Education Plan"









Styrian strategic approach

- "selectiv" school system, dual VET and fulltime school VET at upper Sec. by national law
- National Strategy LLL:2020 as a "frame"
- Regional Education plan (January 2013)
 - Optimizing structur at regional and local level
 - Improving pedagogical process and quality
 - Educational policy innovations
- Strategies for several areas regarding Youth
- Regional Management platforms, integrating all relevant key actors as there are:
 - politicians, administration, social partners, PES, regional associations, etc.







Regional Education Plan - Vision

- Equal opportunities for ALL
 - Open access
 - Fair conditions
 - Comparable quality
- Development and use of all talents and potentials of people
- Connected with 12 strategic areas

Work, employment, health, inclusion, arts and culture, life quality, qualification, social affairs, competitiveness, wealth and welfare







Transfer and Adoption – Why?

- A strategic "model" can't be adopted in an ident way
- But: it is worth, to look at the principles and criteria, and innovative and/ore effective strategic approaches, programmes, measures
- Styria offers:
 - a long-term innovative and "pioneer" role in youth policy
 - A kind of "styrian way" to combine competitive development in politics, economics, education... with an overall common mind of co-operation
 - Good practice in the area of transition school to world of work: dynamic pre-vocational school, guidance in school and outside, reference measures: career catching, counsellor, youth coaching, apprentice coaching, fit for work...
