

# Regional Covid-19 strategy Baden-Württemberg

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# Key measures taken

Short-term: Enhanced financial and education-related engagement

- Focus on **digital equipment** and the **use of digital media**:
  - extra regional budget to provide students with laptops
  - new teacher trainings to promote pedagogical methods of online schooling
  - technical support of staff to enable distance-teaching
  - Digital Campus Baden-Württemberg!

# Key challenges identified by measure implementation

## Short-term challenges and long-term risks

- home schooling barriers for students with disadvantaged financial, social and cultural back-grounds (technical, learning strategies) = gap between disadvantaged and advantaged groups increases
- general long-term challenge: labour market trend = dramatic rise of unemployment in “assistant/lower-skilled” jobs
- women specifically affected by shut-down: childcare + home office + precarious work = higher risk of losing job

# Prospective solutions to improve crisis-reaction

## Consequent focus on innovated learning methods and content

- investing in digital equipment/infrastructure
- long-term focus on embedded learning = online/individualised learning + new approaches of teaching in schools
- improving digital skills of all groups of society (incl. specific IT skills like coding)
- supporting entrepreneurship/innovative businesses (digital sector, digitisation of all areas of life, green industries etc.)
- new “future programmes” for further education
- up-skilling initiatives and training of future skills

# Covid-19 effects in adult education (AE)

## Innovated learning methods and content

### Short-term:

- push for online learning (e.g. via Digital Campus BW + vhs cloud), e.g. language training, non-formal vocational training, school exams
- further development of digitalisation strategies in AE (e.g. “Extended Learning Worlds”)
- massive rise of AE teachers trainings on online learning (online!)

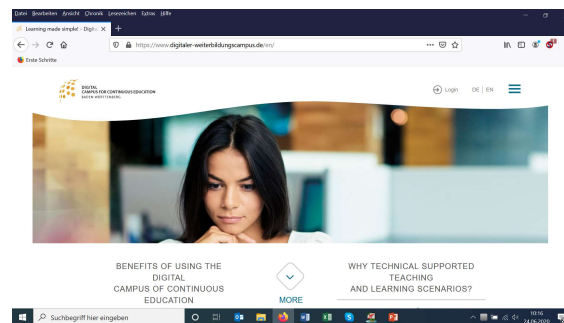
### Long-term:

- need for more professionalised/individualised/embedded learning (e.g. AI in AE)
- increasing digital learning content in AE
- new upskilling options for persons in “assistant” jobs

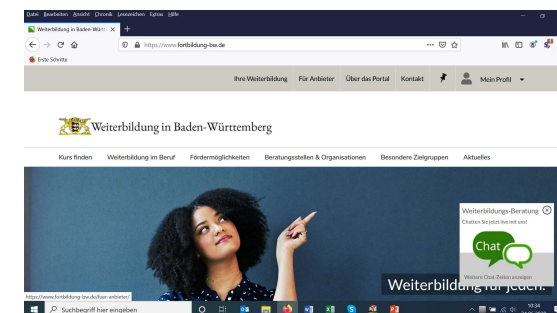

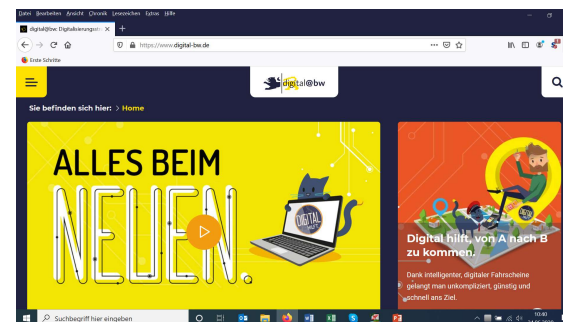
