Resilient Skills Ecosystems for a Crisis-proof Future

The COVID-19 outbreak at the beginning of 2020 has had a great impact in all spheres of life, changing the way in which we relate to each other, communicate and learn. In this context, resilience has emerged as a key skill to face such a crisis and be ready for other potential disruptions that might happen in the future. Therefore, EARLALL launched on 28 May 2020 the <u>Resilient Skills Ecosystems for a Crisis-proof Future initiative</u>, emphasising not only resilience as a skill, but also the need of resilient skills governance systems in order to guarantee that lifelong learning never stops and no one is left behind whatever the circumstances.

Goals

- Find regional and local best practices in crisis management and reaction capacity of education and training systems in the context of COVID-19.
- Identify common challenges and potential areas of cooperation to make skills ecosystems more resilient.
- Set a path for regional and local authorities to build strong, resilient skills ecosystems that are crisis-proof.

Explore new ways in which resilience as a skill can be promoted via curricula as an essential component of key competence 5 (personal, social and learning to learn competence).

Message from EARLALL Presidency (28 May 2020)

The devastating consequences of the Covid-19 pandemic has undoubtedly put a lot of pressure on our regional education and training systems. Education institutions in over 180 countries around the world have closed, impacting almost 90% of the world's student population. Never before have we witnessed educational disruption on such a large scale. Our regions are supporting their education and training centres during this time of crisis to ensure that learning does not stop. It is only appropriate therefore to send our warmest gratitude to the staff of all our regional administrations - to our teachers, trainers, professors, educators, youth workers, etc for their flexibility, devotion and hard work. I would also like to extend my thanks to our learners, apprentices and their families for their commitment to learning despite the difficulties, for their continued efforts and for making us feel proud of what we do.

European cooperation in education and training is now more necessary than ever before. With the sudden closure of schools, universities, adult education institutions and community learning centres, a surge in online and distance learning, and now the partial reopening of education institutions in some contexts, cities and traditional learning providers have forged new partnerships with other stakeholders, including online learning providers and other businesses and organizations with digital resources at their disposal. The governance of education is drastically changing in European regions and cities. Exchanging our experiences, sharing our concerns to try to find the most

appropriate responses to the demands of our territories has been found to be crucial. As Commissioner Schmit remarked on 5 May to the EU Social Affairs and Employment Council, 'We can only overcome this crisis by working together.' And he insisted that 'The post coronavirus recovery will need to put people front and centre.'

It is with those important messages in mind that I believe that, more than ever, EARLALL can provide our regions with the right platform to 'work together' to face our new post crisis scenarios where the digital transition is accelerated (at work and in education and training), where globalisation might have a different meaning, where we need a different approach to collective or public goods and services (green measures, social economy, etc), while safeguarding the well-being of our citizens. The new European Commission's priorities for the next five years, introduced by President Ursula von der Leyen in July 2019, include points that are aligned with EARLALL priorities: a 'Green Deal' to tackle climate change, a reinforced 'European Social Pillar' to support international and internal migration trends, ageing population, and labour market shortages and a 'Europe fit for the Digital age' to promote digitalization and the future of work. In this context, education will have an essential role in successfully embracing these challenges to foster regional development and guarantee the well-being of every single citizen.

As you have all read from EARLALL's newsletter, the Secretariat in Brussels has been actively following up developments and providing timely information on the EU decisions dealing with education and training through a dedicated webpage; four project proposals have been submitted (on building inclusive societies, on building regional capacity in the adult education sector, on skills and labour market alignment and on youth entrepreneurship in rural areas); constant dialogue with the European Commission and other institutions has continued and so has implementation of the EU funded projects involving the association. Lastly, a position paper on Green Skills has been written jointly with the VET providers' network EfVET and it is being disseminated to strategic stakeholders and economic operators. This year's EARLALL General Assembly takes place on 5 and 6 November and will be hosted by Brittany region. It will be dedicated to 'Building Resilient Skills Ecosystems'. We hope that this will be an occasion where we will be able to meet and share our regional strategies regarding skills provision post Covid-19. In the run-up to November, the Secretariat will organise a series of activities that will match our most urgent education and training priorities.

I'm then pleased to announce that in June EARLALL will hold a workshop for its member regions on 'Rethinking VET and adult education systems for long term resilience.' We would like to invite you all to join in a dialogue with representatives from the European Commission and other institutions on how they see the upcoming academic year 20-21 (including mobility actions), what are the headlines of the skills agenda to be published in July, what are the synergies on EU funding programmes that can support the development, acquisition and upskilling of skills and competences, etc. Details will be provided in the near future.

Main activities

COVID-19 report

As a result of the survey carried out by EARLALL Secretariat among EARLALL Member Regions, a report has been published on the occasion of EARLALL Annual Conference 2020, to take place online on 5 November. The report gathers the experience and lessons learnt from 8 EARLALL Member Regions: Basque Country, Brittany, Baden-Württemberg, Catalonia, Tuscany, Rhineland Palatinate, Vestland County and Vidin District.

Online workshop: Rethinking VET and ALE systems for long-term resilience

EARLALL hosted a first online workshop for its Member Regions on 25 June 2020 on the topic of vocational education and training (VET) and adult education systems for a resilient future. The event gathered experts from the European Commission, Cedefop

and regional and local authorities in order to share their perspectives about the future of VET and Adult Education and Learning (ALE). The goal of the workshop was to help to build strategies for resilience based on peer-learning, risk-assessment and crisis prevention mechanisms. Speakers agreed that some of the measures implemented had come to stay, and that a blended learning approach will characterise the way in which education and training systems will work in the years to come.

Online workshop: EU funds to build resilient skills ecosystems

On 28 September 2020, EARLALL and its Member Regions welcomed representatives from the European Commission at an online workshop during which key EU programmes to fund skills-related initiatives were introduced. Regional and local officers, VET and adult education school headmasters, and relevant stakeholders got first-hand

information from the Commission about how they can participate in the upcoming programmes. Even if political negotiations about the EU's next financial period are still ongoing at the Council and the details are uncertain, the main characteristics of the programmes have been already been set out and were shared by Commission representatives.

Online conference: Resilience and skills matching in European regions

In the context of EARLALL Annual Conference 2020 and the launching of the Stride4Stride project (see page 28), EARLALL will host an online conference on 6 November about the measures taken by its Member Regions to react to the COVID-19 outbreak in the spring of 2020 within their education and training systems, taking also into account the labour market challenges posed by the subsequent crisis.

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Thematic areas

Green skills for a green Europe

Building on the "Green Deal" proposal by European Commission's President Ursula von der Leyen, EARLALL has strengthened its work in promoting a green mindset by means of education and training systems. Green skills and a green meaning for regional development will be key to achieve the 2030 and 2050 objectives of sustainable development and climate neutrality, and the regional and local context will be key in achieving them in a just and inclusive way

Policy

Greencomp initiative and platform

The "GreenComp" initiative, initiated by EARLALL and EfVET at the end of 2019, has taken shape during 2020, and has been joined by EAEA. A statement/policy paper was drafted at the beginning of the year to be presented to the European institutions (DG EMPL, DG ENVIRONMENT, Lifelong Learning Interest Group at the European Parliament) and potential partners in order to promote the idea of a green competences framework that integrate them both as a hard skill (skills for the green economy) and a soft skill (green culture).



In the context of the initiative, a survey was launched in September 2020 among members of the three networks to collect best practices following the feedback given by the European institutions on their utmost interest in collecting experience on the topic. A website launching the GreenComp Platform will be published in December 2020 on the occasion of the Lifelong Learning Week, containing also the results of the survey.

Call to empower cities and regions in the Climate Pact

EARLALL jointly signed a call on 22 June 2020 to empower cities and regions in the Climate Pact and mobilise all actors towards decarbonisation, together with Eurelectric, EfVET, EUROCITIES, ERRIN, Energy Cities and ICLEI. Under the premise that the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak and its economic and societal impacts require to rethink the kind of economy that we wish to recover, the seven organisations encouraged the European Commission and the European Parliament to swiftly design and implement the European Climate Pact, acknowledging the importance of its regional and local dimension.

Four key strands of work are proposed in order to achieve these ambitious goals:

Triggering concrete measures in cities and regions across Europe

- Mobilising the whole society along the way towards climate neutrality
- Building on existing initiatives
- Ensuring a goal-driven Climate Pact

Two key elements to guarantee a successful implementation will be

- A skilled workforce for a green industry, to be trained through a reskilling and upskilling effort that allows an efficient economic and industrial transition.
- The promotion and wide acceptance of a green culture among the population, supported by education and training systems, in order to build green and resilient societies that support the transition towards a zero-net emission EU.

Meeting with Commissioner 's Cabinet

On 17 June 2020, EARLALL Director, Noelia Cantero, jointly with EfVET Office Manager, Valentina Chanina, held an online meeting with the Cabinet of Commissioner for Jobs and Social Rights Nicolas Schmit. In particular, the responsible experts for Skills, apprenticeships and VET (Mr Nerlich and Ms Faber) together with Anna Barbieri from DG EMPL (Unit for VET, apprenticeships and adult learning) were present in the discussions. The main aim of the meeting was to discuss the joint position paper by EARLALL and EfVET on Skills for the Green Transition (Green Skills).

The European Comission welcomed the paper and the initiative led by both organisations. All items raised are on their agenda and have been promoted by von der Leyen's Commission, which believes in a Digital and Green new Europe. The dialogue will continue via DG EMPL that encourages EARLALL and EfVET to take up an active role in facilitating cooperation among stakeholders to face green skills challenges and to leave no one behind.

The event kicked off the partnership



between EARLALL and EfVET to promote GreenComp and its development.

As a follow-up activity to the unfolding of the initiative during 2020 and the incorporation of EAEA in the partnership, a new workshop entitled "GreenComp: Taking Green Skills One Step Further" will take place online on 2 December 2020. The new *GreenComp Platform* (see page 9) will be introduced to the general public and high-level representatives.

European Pact for Skills

The European Commission has launched a Pact for Skills to help meet COVID-19 challenges, and deliver on the ambitions of the recovery pathway, the EU Industrial Strategy and the green and digital transition. All stakeholders are called to take part in it: industry, public and private employers, social partners, education and training providers and employment agencies.

EARLALL Secretariat submitted feedback to the consultation by the Commission on the topic in October 2020. The Commission is keen to have regional authorities joining the Pact for its launch, and for that reason a meeting with Anna Barbieri (DG EMPL) took place on 27 October. Some of EARLALL member regions participated in it (Basque Country, Catalonia, Baden Württemberg, Vestland and Borås Municipality) and are keen to consider joining the Pact, which will be officially launched on <u>10 November 2020</u> during the European Vocational Skills Week.

Smart specialisation and VET seminar

Brussels, 30 January 2020

Organised by the European Commission's DG EMPL and Joint Research Centre

The S3 Skills workshop was held at the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT)'s facilities in Brussels on 30 January 2020 to discuss the link between vocational excellence and smart specialisation. The event was based on the notion of vocational excellence as a "new policy concept that aims to maximise the contribution of VET (including at higher level) to innovation and smart specialisation at local and regional level." Regional authorities (among which EARLALL Member Regions Basque Country,

Brittany and Vestland), along with European agencies and institutions, such as the European Training Foundation, Cedefop, EACEA, and several directorategenerals of the European Commission (DG EMPL, DG GROW, DG REGIO), and international organisations (UNESCO-UNEVOC, OECD) were represented in the room.

EU Digital Education Stakeholder Workshop

Brussels, 3-4 March 2020

Organised by the European Commission's DG CONNECT

Experts from a wide range of domains, such as technology-enhanced learning (TEL), artificial intelligence (AI), pedagogics, and all fields of the education sector (formal, non-formal, informal), among others, gathered to discuss about the prospective European funds for digital education; namely, Horizon Europe and Digital Europe. EARLALL Secretariat took part in the discussions and contributed to the debate about linking local needs to the use of specific digital learning tools.

Key messages pointed at a transition "from digital ecosystems to a digital landscape", joining the dots to make digital education a transversal topic, and the need of focusing on the (adequate) use of technology rather than on technology itself as the true catalyser for innovation. On the other hand, raising awareness among the education community about all tools available to increase inclusion was the main challenge identified.

Regional best practices to support apprenticeship systems in the context of the pandemic were showcased, with the participation of two EARLALL Member Regions: Basque Country and Rhineland Palatinate.



Petra Jendrich, Head of Department 'Vocational Schools and Securing the Supply of Skilled Workers', Ministry for Education of Rhineland-Palatinate, introduced the effects of digitalization on Vocational Education and Training (VET). Rikardo Lamadrid, Director of Technology and Advanced Training, Department of Education, Basque Country showcased lessons learnt during the pandemic outbreak. He introduced the measures established by the Basque VET system (FP Euskadi) and implemented by VET centres in the region.

The Excellent Advanced Manufacturing 4.0 project, EXAM 4.0 by its acronym, is one of the five Platforms of VET Excellence approved for funding by the Erasmus+ programme in 2019 under the Centres of Vocational Excellence (CoVE) pilot initiative launched by the European Commission in 2018.

Expected outputs are divided into four key strands: a) learning dialogues (state of art and trend forecasting); b) EXAM 4.0 hub (European platform of VET excellence in advanced manufacturing), Advanced Manufacturing workshop 4.0 (designing, modelling and piloting a 4.0 physical space) and VET 4.0 for Advanced Manufacturing (turning the project achievements into impactful initiatives).

EARLALL published a total of 13 tweets during the day and a total of 80,380 impressions were gathered among the three organising associations, with 22 tweets in total. The campaign was also promoted on other social media, such as Facebook, LinkedIn and Instagram, and partner organisations took part in it, such as Giovanisì and the Goethe Institut (StartNet).

#YESpecialists

In a context of high youth unemployment rates and depopulation in rural areas, entrepreneurship becomes a key element to build an adversity-safe future of Europe and a tool to find alternative ways to deal with labour market challenges. Building local ecosystems focused on promoting and enabling youth entrepreneurship with a glocal perspective can help in tackling these challenges, with teachers and youth workers as key enablers to promote innovative entrepreneurial models in a lifelong learning context. YESpecialist gathers experts from six European regions to create a new innovative



methodology that will build up local ecosystems, introducing non-formal and informal methods into formal education and to promote innovative entrepreneurship concepts.

The project will specially focus on rural areas and will be inclusive regarding young people from vulnerable groups. Cooperation between all actors (authorities, business, NGOs, and schools), with an emphasis on VET teachers and youth workers is key to achieve the project results. Key outputs of the project will be a repository of active youth involvement in local ecosystems at European level, guidelines for building up regional/local ecosystems to promote youth entrepreneurship in rural areas, and a training course for stakeholders aiming at building such ecosystems. The latter will be implemented in two international pilot training courses that will build capacity in rural local contexts while promoting their interconnection at regional, national and European level.

Fostering inclusive societies

Ageing societies, international and internal migration, and the impact of digitalization need to be seen as catalysers for social innovation and sustainable development, rather than challenges to be solved, with especial regard to the local and regional dimension. AMIF

The NEAR project aimed to develop, pilot and evaluate innovative approaches of immigrant-driven social orientation and integration programmes for third-country nationals in European cities and regions. The leading and fundamentally new principle of NEAR is that immigrants themselves are the main actors of the orientation process. Local communities, regional institutions, municipalities, NGOs, sports clubs, cultural groups and other organisations have a supporting role. The project was not selected for funding under the AMIF call 2019 and further options will be explored for its realisation in the upcoming year.

Building regional capacity

European regions and municipalities are in direct contact with citizens, and therefore are very much aware of their needs, but an increase in knowledge of a wider perspective and technical requirements is required to act as a bridge between them and Europe and build a cohesive, yet diverse, European Education Area. With a new programming period beginning in 2021 and ongoing negotiations throughout 2020 on the EU budget and new programmes, EARLALL has promoted the development of regional and local capacity to maximize efficiency and effectiveness in programme management and European tools and instruments.

Policy

Erasmus+ Coalition joint statement on the revised proposal for EU Multiannual Financial Framework 2021-2027

This joint statement was signed by more than 50 stakeholder organisations, among which EARLALL, under the leadership of the Lifelong Learning Platform and the European Youth Forum. The document stresses that the European Commission's revised budget allocation for the Erasmus+ programme published on 21 July 2020 will not be enough to deliver on the ambitious and much needed goals of the future programme for learning mobility, cooperation between organisations and support for policy reform across all sectors, not to mention its contribution to implementing the European Education Area, EU Youth Strategy and the European Green Deal, among other priorities. Valuable new features such as the programme's Inclusion and Diversity Strategy, whose actions aim to ensure broader access and participation, will have little impact without significant additional funding.

#Stride4stride

With the objective of aligning the education and training provision with regional smart specialisation strategies (S3), the Stride for Stride project will work on building up the concept of Regional Skills Ecosystems. Six regions (Catalonia, Basque Country, Tuscany, Brittany, Varaždin, and Vestland) in five European countries (including high achievers, such as Croatia, mid-achievers, such as Norway, and low-achievers such as Spain, Italy and France when it comes to skills matching according to the European Skills Index 2020) will improve their capacity to identify skills needs and adapt their training provision accordingly. And this process needs to be done by engaging four main axes: public authorities, education centres (VET in this case), companies and the individual. Four workshops corresponding to the four steps of skills governance (adaptation, anticipation, transmission and use) will be organised between 2020 and 2022, with a double European-regional perspective that allow all the previously mentioned actors build together skills intelligence systems by means of exchanging their experiences (both
