

## Introduction

In the last years, many European tools have been produced to support quality in education and lifelong learning. This webinar is the second one of a series of online discussions aimed at promoting and understanding the use of relevant EU tools. The webinar, organised by Borås (on behalf of region Västra Götaland) and EARLALL, is aimed to VET (Vocational Education & Training) and ALE (Adult Learning & Education) providers as well as local and regional public authorities dealing with education and training. The webinar seeks to familiarise key actors on the ground with such tools in order to better engage their actions with the European context, which will facilitate their internationalisation and reachout at European level in the long term.

During the first webinar, participants had the chance to familiarise with EPALE, Euroguidance, Europass, ECVET and EQF and the new features that have been proposed. In this second webinar other EU instruments will be introduced during the workshop; each of them provides opportunities to increase the quality of the lifelong learning process and facilitate interaction among practitioners.

• Education providers, education planners, support staff, researchers and academics, and policymakers: SELFIE - this tool anonymously gathers the views of students, teachers and school leaders on how technology is used in the education establishment. The tool generates a report – a snapshot ('SELFIE':-)) of a school's strengths and weaknesses in their use of technology. SELFIE is available for any primary, secondary and vocational schools in Europe and beyond, and in over 30 languages. Since its launch in 2018, it has already reached more than 2 million users.

The new extension **SELFIE** for **WBL** (work based learning), launched in October 2021, brings VET institutions and companies closer together to jointly discuss how to best embed digital technology in the education and training provided. This is why SELFIE for WBL not only gathers the three perspectives of school leaders, VET teachers and learners, but also adds as a fourth perspective the view of in-company trainers.
