The Cultural and Creative Sectors and Industries (CCSI) are one of the most dynamic sectors in Europe, with remarkable share in EU's GDP and workforce. CCSI are at the same time key drivers of sustainable growth and job creation across Europe, important factors of creativity and innovation to other sectors, as well as significant contributors to social and cultural sustainability. The small size of the companies of the sector (around 90% are micro/small/medium-sized) in combination with the severe effects from the economic and the pandemic crisis, make the need for immediate multi-level support of the CCSI imperative.

Project's scope

The CCSI4CCSI project aims at facilitating the triple transition (green, digital, social) for and with the CCSI at regional and interregional level.

Aligned with the specific needs and priorities for the CCSI identified in the participating regions, the partner organisations will learn from each other, co-create and assess initiatives that will:

- Support CCSI actors to develop, transform and innovate
- Promote synergies within the regional ecosystem and crossfertilisation of CCSI with other smart specialisation priority sectors
- Launch community-based projects led by CCSI to jointly address local social challenges

Possible Activities

Exchange of experiences: joint thematic surveys/studies/analysis, interregional study visits, interregional thematic seminars / workshops, peer-reviews, staff exchanges, meetings with stakeholder group (compulsory), joint pilot actions, participation in the Policy Learning Platform activities, preparation of action plans (compulsory only for regions where no policy improvement is achieved by the end of the core phase)
