

Participatory democracy: options at EU level

- Vote or run as a candidate in European elections

- Petitions to the European Parliament

"What is the ECI?"

- The **European Citizens' Initiative** is a participatory democracy tool that gives EU citizens the **right** to have a say in EU policies that affect them, by calling on the European Commission to propose new laws. Once an initiative has reached 1 million signatures, the Commission will decide on what action to take.
- To launch an initiative, it takes 7 EU citizens, living in at least 7 different Member States who are old enough to vote. If 1 million valid signatures are reached within 1 year—they meet with lawmakers and get an official response from the European Commission
- Citizens' initiatives must meet certain criteria



"Why should I care about the ECI?"

- The ECI brings new ideas that haven't been considered yet on the radar of EU and other policymakers
- 2. The ECI gives you and other EU citizens the right to take action on issues you care about and you can help organisers by supporting their ideas



Why "You Are the Present"

It is not easy to talk about "You Are the Present" in one word or one sentence.

You Are the Present, which was held on October 18th, 2021, hosting over 400 people including young people, influencers and institutions, was many things: an event to celebrate the ten years of Giovanisì, the project of the Tuscany Region for the autonomy of young people, which was attended by the President of the Italian Republic Sergio Mattarella and in which the stories of the beneficiaries of the regional project were told, but also stories of positive models of active citizenship, coming from the world of healthcare, innovation and sports, animated by the desire to lead the change.

You Are the Present was also an invitation to young people to position themselves at the forefront, to be direct actors in the social and political life of the Region, to change what most closely concerns them. During the day, 80 young Tuscans under 40 were involved in a participatory process, with the aim of giving life to a debate structured on regional policies regarding the theme of culture.

You are the Present, however, was also a chance to reflect on the progress of European investment funds, the methods of supporting

youth policies and culture, also to better define the lines of action for the future 2021-2027 program, with the annual event of the ERDF (European Regional Development Fund) and ESF (European Social Fund) programs.

The splendid *Villa del Gombo*, recently restored, within the **Migliarino San Rossore Massaciuccoli Park in Pisa**, was the setting for this group of initiatives.
