
To combat gender-based violence online by fostering

Early and late teens through formal and non-formal educational settings by targeting **educational professionals**







Desktop research

Analysis of existing literature on phenomenology and terminology of **GBV online**, the definitions existing at the **European and international levels**, and its key features, causes and consequences, completed with national focus for each menABLE project country.

Part II



Qualitative research

Analysis of results from 18
rounds of focus groups carried
out in each partner country
(Belgium, Denmark and Greece)
consulting young people, formal
and non-formal educators and
21 experts interviewed.




Boys and young men

Hold a critical role in the effort to challenge and combat GBV

































Questioning scenarios presented in the first person, where a group or class debates and offers advice on how a young person should act.






Questions based on academic knowledge about gender, GBV online, and similar topics. Each question includes access to the source material and discussion prompts for students.


