On 27–28 January 2026, the **4th Residential Peer Learning Events** of the SALAM – Sustainable Access to the Labour Market (Interreg Europe) project took place in **Timișoara, Romania**.

Spotlight on Migrant Integration and Peer Learning in Timișoara

During the event, representatives from regional and national institutions emphasised the importance of coordinated approaches to migrant integration.

Speakers, including **Marius Niculae** (West RDA) and **Adrian Mariciuc** highlighted migration as both a challenge and an opportunity, while Liliana Onet and Tiberiu Giurea stressed the role of public authorities in fostering labour market access and social cohesion.

Participants engaged with key stakeholders such as the **West University of Timișoara**, **LOGS – Social Initiative Group**, and the **Department of Social Assistance**, exploring initiatives supporting socio-cultural and professional integration. **Study visits** included the **Emergency Transit Centre for Migrants, a unique facility providing temporary accommodation for refugees**. The second day focused on bilateral exchanges, policy discussions, and project coordination, alongside presentations of European initiatives and future cooperation opportunities.

What's new in the EU?

EU Human Capital Recommendation to Tackle Skills Shortages

In March 2026, the EU Council adopted a Recommendation on Human Capital, urging Member States to invest in skills, lifelong learning, and vocational training. It highlights addressing sectoral shortages, boosting employability, and strengthening cooperation between education providers, employers, and public services to make the labour market more inclusive and resilient.

Skills Portability in the EU — What's New

The EU is advancing the **Skills Portability Initiative** to help workers take their skills, qualifications, and learning outcomes across borders more easily. By digitalising credentials and simplifying recognition procedures, this measure aims to **boost labour mobility, employability, and inclusion, making it easier for people—including vulnerable or disadvantaged groups—to access quality jobs anywhere in the EU.**

It will build on existing tools like the **European Qualifications Framework (EQF) and Europass**, with **proposals expected later in 2026 and potentially into 2027 to simplify recognition procedures**, digitalise credentials and modernise how regulated and non-regulated qualifications are accepted across borders.

Labour market analysis and priorities

European Semester & Inclusion: The European Commission's Autumn Package outlines priorities to boost competitiveness, productivity, and inclusive growth, connecting jobseekers to quality work. EU Council conclusions note that, despite rising employment, poverty and exclusion persist, especially for vulnerable groups.
